These titles are found in the Non-Fiction Section:

- J 398.2 Bru **Anklet for a Princess**
Cinduri, hungry and ragged, is befriended by Godfather Snake, who feeds her delicacies and dresses her in gold cloth and anklets with bells and diamonds, to meet the prince.
- J 398.2 Cli **The Irish Cinderlad**
Becan, a poor boy belittled by his stepmother and stepsisters, rescues a princess in distress after meeting a magical bull.
- J 398.2 Cli **The Persian Cinderella**
A retelling of the traditional Persian tale in which Settareh, neglected and abused by her stepmother and stepsisters, finds her life transformed with the help of a little blue jug.
- J 398.2 Cli **The Egyptian Cinderella**
In this version of Cinderella set in Egypt in the sixth century B.C., Rhodopes, a slave girl, eventually comes to be chosen by the Pharaoh to be his queen.
- J 398.2 Cob **Domitila, A Cinderella Tale from the Mexican Tradition**
By following her mother's admonition to perform every task with care and love, a poor young Mexican girl wins the devotion of the governor's son.
- J 398.2 Dep **Adelita, A Mexican Cinderella**
After the death of her mother and father, Adelita is badly mistreated by her stepmother and stepsisters until she finds her own true love at a grand fiesta.
- J 398.2 Fle **Glass Slipper, Gold Sandal:
A Worldwide Cinderella**
The author draws from a variety of folk traditions to put together this version of Cinderella, including elements from Mexico, Iran, Korea, Russia, Appalachia, and more.
- J 398.2 Hic **The Golden Sandal**
An Iraqi version of the Cinderella story in which a kind and beautiful girl who is mistreated by her stepmother and stepsister finds a husband with the help of a magic fish.

J 398.2 Joh **Bigfoot Cinderrrrrella**
This version of the familiar story in which a mistreated stepchild finds happiness with the "man" of her dreams is set in the old-growth forest and features Bigfoot characters.

J 398.2 Lou **Yeh-Shen: A Chinese Cinderella**
A young Chinese girl overcomes the wickedness of her stepsister and stepmother to become the bride of a prince.

J 398.2 Low **Cindy Ellen, A Wild West Cinderella**
Cindy Ellen loses one of her diamond spurs at the square dance in this wild western retelling of the classic Cinderella story.

J 398.2 Mar **The Rough-Face Girl**
In this Algonquin Indian version of the Cinderella story, the Rough-Face Girl and her two beautiful but heartless sisters compete for the affections of the Invisible Being.

J 398.2 Pol **The Turkey Girl, A Zuni Cinderella**
In this Indian variant of a familiar story, some turkeys make a gown of feathers for the poor girl who tends them so that she can participate in a sacred dance, but they desert her when she fails to return as promised.

J 398.2 San **Sootface: An Ojibwa Cinderella**
Although she is mocked and mistreated by her two older sisters, an Indian maiden wins a mighty invisible warrior for her husband with her kind and honest heart.

J 398.2 San **Cendrillon, Caribbean Cinderella**
A Creole variant of the familiar Cinderella tale set in the Caribbean and narrated by the godmother who helps Cendrillon find true love.

J 398.2 Sie **The Gift of the Crocodile**
In this Indonesian version of the Cinderella story, a girl named Damura escapes her cruel stepmother and stepsister and marries a handsome prince with the help of Grandmother Crocodile.

J 398.2 Tho **The Gospel Cinderella**
A variation on the traditional Cinderella story set in a Southern swamp and with a Great Gospel Convention instead of a ball.

J 495.7 Kor **Korean Cinderella**
A Korean Cinderella story wherein Kongjee is aided in getting to her uncle's wedding by a 100 year-old toad and a maid. Dual language format.

These titles are found in the Picture Book Section:

Bourgeois, K. **Trollerella**
This version of the Cinderella story features a troll living under a bridge who finds an invitation to a ball, where she dances with Prince Charming.

Hughes, S. **Ella's Big Chance: A Jazz-Age Cinderella**
In this version of the Cinderella tale set in the 1920s, Ella has two men courting her--the handsome Duke of Arc and Buttons the delivery boy

Jackson, E. **Cinder Edna**
Cinderella and Cinder Edna, who live with cruel stepmothers and stepsisters, have different approaches to life; and, although each ends up with the prince of her dreams, one is a great deal happier than the other is.

Ketteman, H. **Bubba the Cowboy Prince**
Loosely based on "Cinderella," this story is set in Texas, the fairy godmother is a cow, and the hero, named Bubba, is the stepson of a wicked rancher.

Meddaugh, S. **Cinderella's Rat**
One of the rats that was turned into a coachman by Cinderella's fairy godmother tells his story.

Minters, F. **Cinder-Elly**
In this rap version of the traditional fairy tale, the overworked younger sister gets to go to a basketball game and meets a star player, Prince Charming.

Perlman, J. **Cinderella Penguin**
Cinderella Penguin, the most bewitching bird ever to waddle into a ball. Poor Cinderella is bossed and bullied by her evil stepsisters, envious of her dainty flippers and fins.

Thaler, M. **Cinderella Bigfoot**
Cinderella's Dairy Godmother helps her get to the ball and outfits her with a pair of glass sneakers for her really big feet.
