

- 306.89 Ber Good Answers to Tough Questions About Divorce**
Discusses what divorce is, why people divorce, and what happens to the children.
- 306.89 Bin Why do Families Break Up?**
Examines why marriages and partnerships fail and what happens to the children when they do.
- 306.89 Bro Dinosaurs Divorce**
Text and illustrations of dinosaur characters introduce aspects of divorce such as its causes and effects, living with a single parent, spending holidays in two separate households, and adjusting to a stepparent.
- 306.89 Cad My Parents are Getting Divorced: How to Keep it Together When Your Mom and Dad are Splitting Up.**
Explains the feelings and questions shared by young adults whose parents are getting divorced, the changes that could occur, and how to deal with them.
- 306.89 Eks Where am I Sleeping Tonight?**
In an Easy Reader format, a child recounts how it can sometimes be difficult to keep things organized when you have two homes.
- 306.89 Hee When Mom and Dad Separate**
Idea and activity sheets to facilitate discussion and feelings through the use of drawing.

KoKo Bear learns what divorce means, how to deal with changes, how to recognize and deal with feelings, and that divorce is not KoKo's fault.

 A Story for Little Kids About Divorce**
A little boy learns that he did not cause his parent's divorce because of the mess he made with chocolate pudding, and describes his new life living with his dad and seeing his mom on weekends.

A young boy named Alex enjoys the homes of both of his parents who live apart but love Alex very much.

**306.89 Moo When My Parents Forgot
 How to be Friends**
A simple explanation of divorce reassures youngsters that they are not responsible for their parents' breaking up and that their parents still love them even though they no longer live together.

Explains the emotional and practical problems that arise when family members separate because the parents are breaking up, discussing what happens to the children, how life will change, and how it will be the same.

After reluctantly talking with her parents about their upcoming divorce, a young girl discovers that there will be some big changes but that their love for her will remain the same.
